The Regular Meeting of the West Baton Rouge Parish Council was held on Thursday, March 24, 2016 and called to order at 6:30pm. Council Chairman Gary Spillman requested that all electronic devices be placed on silent as the meeting opened with The Pledge of Allegiance led by Ms. Naomi Fair.

Roll-Call Pro System recorded the following members as being present:

Messrs. Chris "Fish" Kershaw, Ricky Loupe, Barry Huggins, Edward G. "Bob" Robertson, Gary Spillman, Phil Porto Jr., Kirk Allain, Mses. Naomi Fair and Charlene Gordon.

Also present were, Mr. Riley Berthelot, Parish President and Ms. Michelle Tullier, Council Clerk.

A motion was made by Mr. Chris Kershaw, seconded by Mr. Barry Huggins, to approve the minutes of the March 10, 2016 regular meeting.

Roll-Call Pro System recorded the votes on the motion as follows:

As a result of the votes the motion was adopted.

Chairman Spillman moved on to item #5 Consider any Amendments to the Agenda, there were two items to consider. Resolution of support on Westport Ext. Project and Accept/Reject bid recommendations for 2016 budgeted tractors for Drainage Dept. Chairman Spillman noted that the resolution will not be taken up at this time therefore this item will not be amended onto the agenda, he clarified the bid recommendation would be the only item that needs to be included on tonight's agenda. There were no questions at this time.

A motion was made by Mr. Barry Huggins, seconded by Ms. Charlene Gordon to amend tonight's agenda to include the aforementioned item.

Roll-Call Pro System recorded the votes on the motion as follows:

As a result of the votes the motion was unanimously adopted by present members and the agenda therefore amended.

Chairman Spillman moved on to item #6 State of the Parish and recognized Parish President Berthelot, who read aloud the State of the Parish report, which included items such as:

Revenue increased by 1.3 million dollars mainly due to industrial activity

Parish General Fund increased by 2.5 million

Sales Tax Revenue collections reached record levels- coming in 49% over budget
Surplus fund increases due to one-time monies
Various Capital Outlay projects
Master Plan update
Levee Trails

President Berthelot finished by thanking the Parish Council, his staff and each parish employee for the essential roles they play in successful parish management.

There were no questions for President Berthelot at this time, the complete State of the Parish can be found at the end of these minutes.

President Berthelot remained at the podium for item #7 Parish Presidents Report and started by reading aloud a Proclamation proclaiming the month of April, Fair Housing Month. Said Proclamation can be found at the end of these minutes.

President Berthelot continued on with his report and covered the following items:

Press Release from Capital Region Legislators Meeting with Governor Edwards which covered various transportation and economic development infrastructure projects;

There were a few questions from the council on certain transportation projects listed on the aforementioned press release, President Berthelot gave further detail on how dollars would possibly be spent on listed projects. There were no further questions at this time.

Chairman Spillman moved on to item#8 Public Comments, there were no public comments at this time.

Chairman Spillman moved on to item #9 Communication with Council Members and/or Elected or Appointed Officials, specifically item #9a) Zika Virus Presentation – Mr. George Bragg, Mosquito Control Director was recognized and presented the council with a slideshow presentation on the Zika virus. Mr. Bragg covered the following topics:

What is the Zika Virus, why is Zika different, current statistics, controlling the virus, plan to deal with the virus, and in closing Mr. Bragg offered various websites available to the public for more information on Zika. Links to these websites along with more information on Zika can be found on the West Baton Rouge Mosquito Control Page at <http://www.wbrcouncil.org/Departments/Mosquito-Abatement>. The council asked a few questions and thanked Mr. Bragg for the in depth information on the Zika virus.

Chairman Spillman moved on to item #10 Public Hearing on previously introduced Ordinances, and announced that a Public Hearing was in order at this time and all interested persons were invited to appear and be heard on ...An Ordinance Amending Chapter 104 Zoning to Incorporate Amended Zoning Designation Map (Zoning Plan) under Sec. 104-3 Establishment of Districts, Official Zoning Map for rezoning request of Patrick McGibboney and TPA 190 Property LLC., File # 2016-01, Tract G-3-A, containing 11.33 acres of Belair Industrial Park, Section 49, T6S, R12E, West Baton Rouge Parish, Physically located at 991 Hwy 190 West, Port Allen, La 70767, rezoning from I-1 (Light Industrial) to I-2 (Moderate Industrial). Master Plan Change.

Ms. Michelle Tullier, Council Clerk, read aloud the minutes from the recent Zoning Commission meeting in reference to the above rezoning request, which resulted in the commission recommending a 6 month special use permit for outdoor storage of pipe instead of the requested I-2 zoning, the votes were 5 Yeas and 0 Nays with 4 members absent.

Mr. Brennan Easley owner of Trade Construction and TPA Property was recognized and explained he needed the current I-2 zoning in order to use the property as a laydown yard for pipe and various other items. Mr. Easley stated he has a three to five year commitment from his client and is not really interested in the 6 month temporary special use permit due to the amount of money he is having to put forward to get the property cleaned up and ready for what he needs to do on it. Mr. Spillman clarified the verbiage in the Parish Code of Ordinances in reference to the 6 month time frame on a special use. Mr. Kershaw, spoke and was shocked that laydown yards for pipe was not covered in an I-1 zoning and he stated that maybe we need to get that fixed, quoted previous councilman Randy Mouch stating "If you can't put Industrial Property in this area, where can you put it?" Mr. Kershaw also commented that

he could support the temporary special use permit, but if we do not fix the code to include outdoor storage in I-1 before this comes in front of the council in 6 months, he will then push for an I-2 zoning. President Berthelot was recognized and pointed out, this property since TPA has taken over has been cleaned up and looks much better than before, stated also that the administration is in full support of the council's decision on this rezoning.

Mr. Loupe was recognized and concurred what Mr. Kershaw stated earlier.

Mr. Huggins started off by agreeing with Mr. Kershaw on the Randy Mouch quote, he then questioned the Zoning Commission not making a recommendation on the actual request for the I-2 zoning, they did not address the I-2 request, nor give a reason for a denial. Mr. Huggins also questioned how this was zoned as I-1 when the parish implemented zoning, if the original zoning was based off of current use. He finished by addressing the intent for the 6 month special use language and commented that other changes in the Industrial language will be needed in the future from time to time.

Mr. Porto, reviewed the surrounding properties zones and recommended going along with what the zoning commission recommended.

A motion as made by Mr. Phil Porto, seconded by Mr. Barry Huggins to approve the 6 months special use permit to allow outdoor storage in I-1 and prepare an ordinance to allow open storage in I-1 without any special use permit.

Mr. Easley spoke up and questioned spending any more money on this laydown yard, commenting he is worried that after spending that money, if the special use were to fall through he would be out that money.

A substitute motion was then made by Mr. Chris Kershaw, seconded by Mr. Kirk Allain to rezone the aforementioned property from I-1 to I-2.

There were no further public comments either for or against said ordinance. No written protests opposing the ordinance were received. The Council Chairman at this point declared the Public Hearing concluded and opened discussion up to the council.

Chairman Spillman moved on to item #10b Public Hearing on previously introduced Ordinances, and announced that a Public Hearing was in order at this time and all interested persons were invited to appear and be heard on An Ordinance authorizing the issuance of not to exceed Two Million Six Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$2,650,000) of Revenue Refunding Bonds, Series 2016, of West Baton Rouge Fire Protection District No. 1 of the Parish of West Baton Rouge, State of Louisiana; prescribing the form, terms and conditions thereof and providing for the payment thereof; awarding such Bonds to the purchaser thereof; and providing for other matters in connection therewith.

There were no public comments either for or against said ordinance. No written protests opposing the ordinance were received. The Council Chairman at this point declared the Public Hearing concluded and opened discussion up to the council. There were no questions or discussion from the council at this time.

Jefferson Avenue, Port Allen, La 70767.

President Berthelot was recognized and explained the need for this proposed ordinance was to relocate a polling place, due to the low number of registered/qualified voters in this particular precinct.

There were no public comments either for or against said ordinance. No written protests opposing the ordinance were received. The Council Chairman at this point declared the Public Hearing concluded and opened discussion up to the council. There were no questions or discussion from the council at this time.

A motion to approve the aforementioned ordinance was made by Ms. Charlene Gordon, seconded by Mr. Edward Robertson.

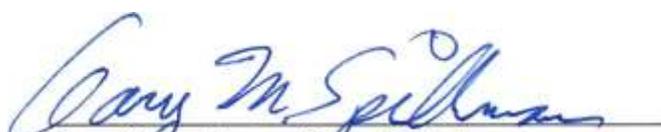

STATE OF THE PARISH ADDRESS
March 24, 2016

Mr. Chairman, Council Members and Citizens of West Baton Rouge Parish:

I am pleased to report that as of the end of Fiscal Year 2015, the Parish of West Baton Rouge remained financially stable. Revenue increased by 1.3 million dollars mainly due to the continuation of industrial construction activity. The Parish General Fund increased by 2.5 million dollars and Sales Tax Revenue Collections reached record level - coming in 49% over budgeted amounts.

Surplus funds created by one-time sales tax collections have been set aside for non-recurring capital improvement projects in keeping with the WBR Parish Master Plan pertaining to transportation and mobility. The goal is to increase efficiency, capacity and connectivity, critical factors in relief of overburdened infrastructure. Mobility for parish residents and access of first responders remains one of my top concerns.

More than 2.5 million dollars was spent on Capital Outlay Projects. Nearly 1 million dollars was spent for 3 miles of road overlays on Landry Lane and Rowecliff Street along with repairs to Commercial Drive, South Westport Drive and Charles Drive. Approximately 800,000 dollars was spent for Capital Improvements Projects including 911 and communication equipment/software upgrades, Lukeville Lane Sewer Improvements, light retrofits and the Diversion Canal Project. Nearly 750,000 dollars was spent for Capital Outlay Projects at Parish parks including volleyball Courts, Playgrounds, Levee Top Trails and Rivault Park field reconfiguration and facility upgrades.

I appreciate the Parish Council for their support of an update of the Parish Master Plan. This process is underway and is expected to be presented back to the Council in September of 2016. The Office of Community Planning and Development continues to work on modeling future transportation, housing and land use needs along with the Chamber; as well as targeting specific locations in the Parish for additional retail development through good site design. Phase I of the South End Levee Trails (in Brusly) is near completion and Phase II is in the final permitting and design phase. Funds have been budgeted for the Parish to begin construction of 1.0 mile of levee-top near that Trailhead.

I deeply appreciate the help and support of the Parish Council, my staff and each Parish Employee for the essential role they play in successful parish management.

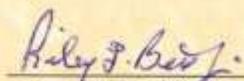
- WHEREAS,** the strength of our nation flows from the promise of individual equality and freedom of choice; and

FAIR HOUSING MONTH

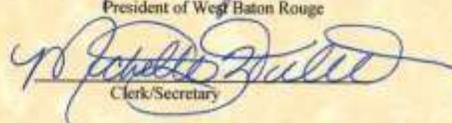

An Ordinance Amending Chapter 104 Zoning to Incorporate Amended Zoning Designation Map (Zoning Plan) under Section 104-3 Establishment of Districts, Official Zoning Map.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the West Baton Rouge Parish Council in legal session that Chapter 104 Zoning, Sec. 104-3 Establishment of Districts, Official Zoning Map of the Compiled Ordinances of the Parish of West Baton Rouge, Louisiana is amended and re-enacted to read as follows:

Sec.104-3. Establishment of districts, official zoning map for rezoning request of Patrick McGibboney and TPA 190 Property LLC., File # 2016-01, Tract G-3-A Containing 11.33 acres of Belair Industrial Park, Section 49, T6S, R12E, West Baton Rouge Parish, Physically located at 991 Hwy 190 West, Port Allen, La 70767, rezoning from I-1 (Light Industrial) to I-2 (Moderate Industrial).

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED by the West Baton Rouge Parish Council that this Ordinance shall also serve as a Master Plan Change.

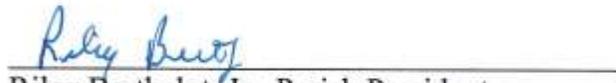

The following ordinance, which was previously introduced in written form at a regular meeting of the Parish Council, acting as the Governing Authority of West Baton Rouge Parish Fire Protection District No. 1, a summary thereof having been published in the official journal, together with a notice of public hearing which was held on February 25, 2016, in accordance with said public notice, was brought up for final passage on motion of Mr. Ricky Loupe and seconded by Ms. Charlene Gordon:

ORDINANCE 8 OF 2016

An ordinance authorizing the issuance of not to exceed Two Million Six Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$2,650,000) of Revenue Refunding Bonds, Series 2016, of West Baton Rouge Parish Fire Protection District No. 1; prescribing the form, terms and conditions thereof and providing for the payment thereof; awarding such Bonds to the purchaser thereof; and providing for other matters in connection therewith.

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 10-D of Title 33 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, as amended, and other constitutional and statutory authority, the Louisiana Local Government Environmental Facilities and Community Development Authority (the "LCDA") previously issued its Revenue Bonds (Port Allen Fire Station Project), Series 2008 (the "Series 2008 Bonds"), of which \$2,390,000 is outstanding; and

WHEREAS, the LCDA loaned the proceeds of the Series 2008 Bonds to the West Baton Rouge Parish Fire Protection District No. 1 (the "Issuer") pursuant to a Loan Agreement dated as of July 1, 2008 by and between the LCDA and the Issuer (the "2008 Loan Agreement"); and

WHEREAS, in order to provide debt service savings, the Issuer desires to refund all or a portion of its obligations owed pursuant to the 2008 Loan Agreement (the "Refunded Obligations"), pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 14-A of Title 39 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, as amended, and other constitutional and statutory authority (the "Act"), through the issuance of its refunding bonds; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Issuer desires to accomplish the refunding through the issuance of not exceeding \$2,650,000 of its Revenue Refunding Bonds (the "Bonds"), to be secured by and payable from the income, revenues, and receipts of the Issuer derived from any source whatsoever so long as such income, revenues, and receipts are not legally dedicated for the purposes incompatible with the Bonds (the "Unrestricted Revenues"); and

WHEREAS, the Parish Council of the Parish of West Baton Rouge, State of Louisiana, acting as the governing authority of the Issuer, gave preliminary approval on January 28, 2016, to the issuance of the Bonds, which was approved by the Louisiana State Bond Commission on March 17, 2016; and

WHEREAS, it is now desired to fix the details necessary with respect to the issuance of the Bonds and to provide for the sale, authorization and issuance thereof; and.....

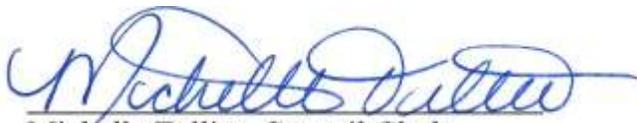
